
During her free time Dr. White enjoys spending time with her family at Lake Lure, riding horses with

Wellness

We believe an ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure. Preventing diseases, illnesses and

parasites is always less stressful, less expensive and safer than treating these conditions. We want your companions healthy and by your side as long as possible. We know the best care comes from an informed, observant owner and regular checkups by the veterinarian.



In-house Labwork

Just as in human medicine, early detection and treatment can add years to your pet's life.



Laboratory testing is the most sensitive means doctors have for early diagnosis of infection, blood disorders, diabetes, kidney and liver disease, thyroid function, hormonal problems and cancer. Lab testing is espe-

cially important before anesthesia procedures. Blood work helps detect conditions which could make anesthesia unsafe and aids in the selection of the best type of anesthesia for your pet. Our state-of-the-art Idexx equipment allows us to evaluate over 95% of our tests in-house. For emergencies and time critical cases, this ability is invaluable.

In-house Cytology

Microscopic parasites, bacterial infection and individual cell conditions provide vital clues about ill-



ness and disease. The Doctor's ability to interpret individual results in relationship to each other provides further diagnostic information. This takes years of training and experience.

Dentistry

The same natural processes that cause us to need routine dental care are at work on our pets too. Our doctors see plaque buildup, periodontal diseases and tooth damage every day. They are among the most common and most preventable medical conditions we see. When allowed to progress, these conditions can quickly cause pain, oral infections and a decline in general health. Studies show bacteria in plaque buildup (below left) invade the bloodstream through affected gums and cause liver and heart disease. Cleaned (below right), and the source is gone. The good news is that proper periodontal care adds an average of two years to a pet's life.





Radiography

This non-invasive diagnostic tool provides valuable information for the veterinarian with minimal stress on the patient.

Surgery

From the routine spays and neuters to orthopedic and emergency surgeries, our DVMs are qualified to perform a wide range of procedures. If your pet needs specialized care, we work closely with board



certified specialists in the region. Our goal is to provide the best care options for your pet.

Pharmacy

To provide the medications your pet needs, as quickly as possible, we carry a wide range of prescription drugs. Our veterinarians know which drugs will be most effective for your pet's condition and assure they have been stored correctly.

Pain Management: Medical studies show proactive pain management significantly increases survival rates in critical cases and speeds recovery in all cases. In keeping with the highest standards of veterinary medicine, we provide and prescribe pain relief medications for all surgical procedures, traumas and pain conditions.

Geriatric Testing and Support: Like us, our pets are more likely to have health problems as they age. Early detection and treatment can greatly improve their longevity and quality of life.

Fertility Testing / Artificial Insemination: Fertility testing can identify male counts and peak female ovulation time. Artificial insemination can be safer and more productive.

Dermatology: Itching, hair loss and skin irritations can have several causes. Testing is necessary to identify the problem so the appropriate treatment can be selected.

Allergy Testing and Treatment: Allergies can make a pet miserable. After testing for allergic sensitivities a injectable serum specific to the pet's allergies can provide significant relief.

Referral Services: We work closely with board certified specialists in the region. Our goal is to provide the best care options for your pet.

Acupuncture: Acupuncture is used for problems that involve paralysis, noninfectious inflammation (such as allergies), and pain.

Specialty Diets: Many conditions can be helped by proper nutrition. We stock Purina prescription diets because of their quality ingredients and commitment to improvement.
